State of affairs of IR in Uzbekistan universities

- Intensive mobility to British, German, Japanese, French and American academic and research institutions
- Some mobility to Swedish, Canadian and South Korean universities
- Non-perception of other Baltic countries as study destination

State of affairs of IR in Uzbekistan universities

- Cooperation done mainly within the framework of “supporting” institutions, like British Council, DAAD, Tempus etc
- Few direct university-university and student-university contacts
- Increasing attention from students and faculty members to academic mobility and exchange

- Pertinent composition of participants
- Wide geographical coverage (3 continents, 10 countries)
- Rich content of the program: comprehensive information about scholarships and grants, universities, supporting institutions/programs
- Cultural component
