<p>Key focus area</p>	<p>HUWISU offers a wide variety of interdisciplinary subject courses as well as intensive and semi-intensive German language courses for students of all academic levels</p> <p>The courses at HUWISU are all thematically related to the city of Berlin and will hold ample space for interesting lectures and discussions from this vantage point.</p> <p>Students with different academic backgrounds complete this short term program, either on-site or online, lasting between two and four weeks.</p>	<p>Humboldt Internship Program offers students the opportunity for experiential learning through internships in research projects or start-ups at Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin.</p> <p>Participants can conduct internships on-site in Berlin or remotely. They are part of academic work teams, deal with challenging tasks, expand their network, and explore Berlin (virtually). An innovative working environment and processes of knowledge transfer characterize the work projects.</p>	<p>Berlin Perspectives offers interdisciplinary seminars for international exchange students, in addition to the subject courses at their faculty. Using the city of Berlin as a local focus point, the seminars invite students from different disciplinary and cultural backgrounds to engage with different aspects of German history, society, and culture.</p> <p>Seminars are taught in English or in bilingual formats (English/German).</p>	<p>Humboldt Perspectives Study Abroad offers undergraduate students from across the globe the opportunity to complete a study period of three months at Humboldt-Universität. The program consists of academic courses, intercultural training, language courses, and excursions in the city of Berlin.</p> <p>Courses are taught in English and offer an interdisciplinary approach to a wide range of topical issues related to Berlin, Germany, and Europe. The accompanying intercultural training is an integral part of the program.</p>	<p>The programs offer a variety of academic disciplines, diverse study opportunities and a unique international experience. Students can participate in one program, combine courses within one program (except internships) or participate in different programs successively.</p> <p>All programs aim to include the students' diverse backgrounds and experiences into the learning process, enabling them to develop content knowledge as well as intercultural and academic skills.</p>
<p>Cultural Activities</p>	<p>The cultural activities vary depending on the specific program of Humboldt International Campus and the season. In Berlin, participants are invited to take part in a fine selection of excursions, sports activities, cultural events, and social gatherings. Participants of our online programs gain a digital insight into the diversity and cultural life of Berlin. Besides, they can get to know each other at virtual meetings.</p> <p>For Berlin Perspectives students, excursions in the city of Berlin are an integral part of Berlin Perspectives courses. In addition, the university offers various cultural activities and workshops for international students enrolled at HU (please refer to the Students Welcome Centre).</p>
