Key focus area	Humboldt Winter and Summer University offers a wide variety of interdisciplinary subject courses and intensive and semi-intensive German language courses for students of all academic levels. The HUWISU courses are thematically related to the city of Berlin and will hold ample space for interesting lectures and discussions from this vantage point. Students from various academic backgrounds can complete this short-term program, which runs from two to four weeks.	Humboldt Internship Program offers students experiential learning through three-month stays in research projects or start-ups at Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin. Participants are part of academic work teams, deal with challenging tasks, expand their network, and explore Berlin (virtually). An innovative working environment and processes of knowledge transfer characterize the work projects.	Humboldt Perspectives Study Abroad offers undergraduate students from across the globe the opportunity to complete a study period of 4 months at Humboldt- Universität. The program consists of academic courses, German language courses, accompanying intercultural and research training workshops, and excursions in Berlin. Courses are taught in English and offer an interdisciplinary, research-oriented approach to various topical issues related to Berlin, Germany, and Europe.	Berlin Perspectives offers interdisciplinary seminars for international exchange students in addition to the subject courses at their faculty. Using the city of Berlin as a local focal point, the classes invite students from different disciplinary and cultural backgrounds to engage with various aspects of German history, society, and culture. Seminars are taught in English or bilingual formats (English/German). Excursions in the city of Berlin are part of the courses.	With the International Parliamentary Scholarships (IPS), the German Bundestag gives the opportunity to experience how German politics work. The core element is a work placement with a member of the German Bundestag. Program options: International Scholarship Program Program for Arab countries Program for Sub- Saharan African countries Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin cooperates with Deutscher Bundestag, Freie Universität Berlin and Technische Universität Berlin for the IPS program.	The Franco-German Parliamentary Internship Program offers participants from France and Germany a unique opportunity to learn how German and French politics work. After an introductory part at either Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin (for French participants) or Sciences Po Paris (for German participants), the core element is a work placement with a member of the German Bundestag (for French participants) or Assemblée Nationale (for German participants).
